<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Treasure counting with coins • Pirates and patch shapes • Feed the pirate gold coin letters <p>Goals: Review letters learned by playing fun games, matching shape patches and matching coins to the treasure numbers 1-9.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “I spy” parrot using our words to find the parrot (taking turns) • Make a “classroom” treasure chest together • Read “<u>Where The Wild Things Are</u>” & pretend to go on our own Adventure together! <p>Goals: Becoming familiar with our pirate theme by using visuals to help us better understand and doing fun activities at circle.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Design a flag for our “pirate” ship • Make an “Our High Seas Tales” Book together • Build a “pirate ship” together to sail & practice taking turns <p>Goals: Learning about pirates by playing fun games, working together to make items pirates love and pretending we are pirates.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pirate play dough: add black paint and glitter • Water fun with boats • Treasures in the sand: look for treasures <p>Goals: Learn about under the sea by making different kinds of sensory bins and using the items to better understand the theme.</p>

Practice following directions.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Design a bird with a styrofoam ball & add eyes, feathers etc. • Put “jewels” in a bottle with sand • “Wash the deck” with soap & water <p>Goals: Develop practical life skills that will help us later in life by doing fun activities we can do by ourselves.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pirate’s parrot for our shoulders • Paper plate pirate • Individual storm bottles <p>Goals: To expand creativity using different materials. To listen to directions and follow them. Explore the world around us.</p>
